Length: Depending on the amount of parent volunteers, each presentation will be about 10 minutes in length.

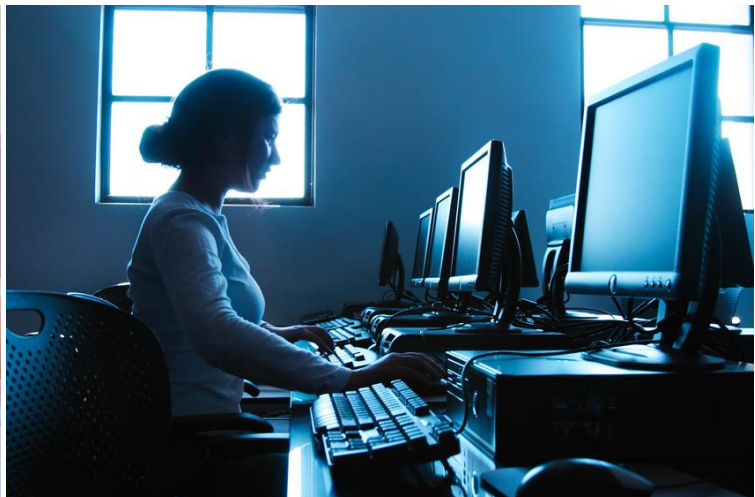
