
School Directors' Dinner

Held on January 30, 2014, the School Directors Dinner honors York County School Board members and superintendents for their service. At the Dinner, Dr. Michael Thew was honored with a Resoution of Appreciation for his commitment to YCAL.



The evening's program highlighted the Career Opportunities Program (COPS) and featured:

- An awards ceremony honoring three superintendents and 16 York County School Board members for their years of service
- Deb Rohrbaugh, Associate Director, Kinsley Education Center, shared the benefits that Kinsley receives from working with students including the ability to recruit students with a sincere interest in construction into the Kinsley apprenticeship program
- Jud Stauffer, School to Work Coordinator, Dallastown Area School District, discussed how COPS helps students identify career options and gives the students' opportunities to develop their knowledge, skills and abilities
- Amanda Moose, a student at West York Area High School, spoke about the opportunity she had through COPS to work with human resources professionals to build employability skills which led her to pursue a career in cosmetology
- Jazeah Gray, a student at Central York High School, shared that through COPS she was able to explore many career options, create networks and build relationships with business professionals which led to securing an internship at a dental practice



Career Exploration Programs

Career Exploration Programs, formerly referred to as Mentoring Programs, are sponsored by York County employers and allow students to spend time with business representatives to explore a particular career path. The programs provide hands-on experience, preparation and guidance for students and their future careers.



Alexander Iula, a 2013 graduate of Dallastown Area High School, participated in YCAL's Culinary Career Exploration Program during his junior year, but discovered that a career in the culinary field was not for him.

During his senior year, Alexander participated in the YCAL's Hospitality Career Exploration Program and decided to pursue a career in the hospitality industry.

Through his participation in the Program, Alexander gained a better understanding of the culinary and hospitality industries and was able to connect and network with industry professionals. These connections led to Alexander securing a position at Heritage Hills Golf Resort & Conference Center and earning an internship at the York County Convention and Visitors Bureau. Alexander is currently studying Hospitality Management at York College of Pennsylvania.

Jennifer Golden, a 2012 graduate of Red Lion Area High School, participated in the Insurance Career Exploration Program at Glatfelter Insurance Group.
